In addition, the activities of the second year of Jean Monnet Module "Solidarity in EU Law" are going on continuously! On Thursday 13, Friday 14 and Monday 17 May 2021, **Professor Pietro Milazzo's Jean Monnet course "Right to Health and Solidarity in EU Law"** took place remotely, for a total of six lecturing hours. During the lectures, Prof. Pietro Milazzo (Professor of Constitutional Law at the University of Pisa and Key Staff Member of our Jean Monnet Module) took in consideration the role of EU Law for the implementation of solidarity in health matters and analysed the tools and the mechanisms aimed at reducing health inequalities in Europe. Specific attention was given to the interpretation of art. 35 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the EU, devoted to "Health care". Students also learnt that, at EU level, there is a link between the health of immigrants and the health of all EU citizens.

On Thursday 20 May 2021, three hours of **Professor Estelle Brosset's Jean Monnet course** "Environment protection and Solidarity in EU Law" took place remotely. During the lectures, Prof. Estelle Brosset (Professor of Public Law at Aix-Marseille University and Key Staff Member of our Jean Monnet Module) aimed at deepening the understanding of how solidarity is implemented in EU Environmental Law. It was questioned what are the solidarity duties that potentially derive from art. 37 of the Charter of Fundamental Rights, which states: "A high level of environmental protection and the improvement of the quality of the environment must be integrated into the policies of the Union and ensured in accordance with the principle of sustainable development". The lectures also dealt with concrete examples of solidarity within existing European Union Environmental and Natural Resources Law and Policy, and with the

relevant case law.


